We have secured an exclusive visit to the new Elephant Enclosure at the Werribee Open Range Zoo that will take us behind the scenes, (not open to the public) on the Saturday, 21st February 2026. The Werribee Open Range Zoo are proud to showcase their new purpose built structure that houses the elephants that have been recently moved from the Melbourne Zoo in Parkville.

The event is designed to appeal to both our professional members and their families, a first GREG family day. The official tour starts at 1:00pm. Ensure you are at least 30mins early to sign in. Unfortunately children under 8 years of age are not permitted to join the "behind the scenes" tour.

After the guided behind the scene tour of the Elephant enclosure, at 2:00pm, attendees will be given a guided walk through of the zoo's public area with commentary on design, infrastructure, sustainability and engineering solutions used across the open range zoo. There are no age restrictions for this part of the tour. (Valid Zoo pass required).

IMPORTANT SAFETY NOTE! The Werribee Zoo safety policy prohibits children under 8 year of age to enter the secured non-public areas. Closed foot wear MUST be worn.





IMPORTANT NOTE ON TICKETS:

All attendees must also purchase a Zoo entrance ticket or already have valid Zoo Pass in addition to the GREG Humanitix ticket. Therefore it is essential to be early to ensure sufficient time to buy a day Zoo entrance ticket prior to the tour. Zoo entrance ticket is not included in the GREG Humanitix ticket price as there are multiple ticket pricing including annual membership pass. Some members may already hold family or annual Zoo membership pass which will negate buying an entrance ticket on the day.
